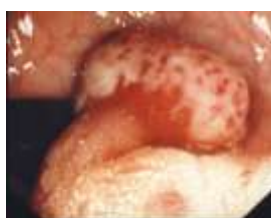

Aims:

Develop internationally recognised evidence based guidelines on behalf of ESPGHAN by spring 2018.

1. Developed in conjunction with the membership of working group
2. Based on current published evidence
3. Peer reviewed by expert clinicians in this field

Increase the understanding and improve the quality of care for patients < age 18 years with polyposis and inherited colorectal cancer syndromes

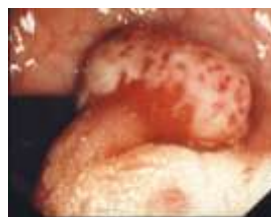
1. Publish and disseminate knowledge
2. Interface with adult groups with expertise in these conditions (InSight).
3. Oversee good quality research in this field to further the care of these conditions.
4. Improve quality and timing of endoscopic surveillance

Meetings:

1. Annually ESPGHAN each annual meeting.
2. Email group with updates of guidelines and involving all members in guideline writing.
3. Twice yearly meeting of members of the core group to move forward ideas and plan future projects.

Governance

This working group reports initially to ESPGHAN endoscopy group and to the academic body of ESPGHAN. All work submitted for publication to be peer reviewed by relevant adult academic body (International Society for Gastrointestinal Hereditary Tumours (InSiGHT))
